It will be heavily used for walking, jogging, cycling, rollerblading, and cross-country skiing. The Framingham section of the trail is currently under development and the Natick section is in the planning stage. The first portion of the Cochituate Rail Trail, extending from Route 30 to Old Connecticut Path in Framingham, is expected to open to early next year. The trail will provide countless recreational options for area residents, will be an important link between the surrounding neighborhoods and communities and will provide alternative means of transportation to and from Framingham and Natick.
